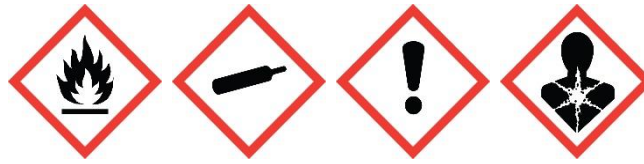

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### Section 4. First aid measures

#### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

#### 4.2. Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

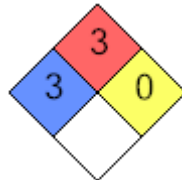
